

Registration Information for 2010-2011/5771 Academic Year

Dear Parents:

Registration for the Mirochnick Religious School 2010-11/5771 term is about to begin! In order to deliver the most effective educational experience possible, we start planning for the new school year well in advance. **Here's how you can help – register your child now!** The earlier we know the composition of next year's class, the better we can plan for your child. **That's why we offer a financial incentive to register your child by June 1st.** Please see the enclosed registration form for more information on tuition and early registration discounts.

For your convenience we have pre-filled in most of the information on the enclosed Registration and Medical Information Form, as well as a Payment Remittance Form. Review this information carefully and make any pertinent changes before you return them to the main synagogue office, along with the required 50% tuition deposit for enrollment. For your convenience, you may pay by cash, check, Visa, MasterCard or American Express. The balance of the tuition will be due by August 1, 2009.

For the past two years our Shabbat Program has been a huge success; we're planning to continue with Shabbat (Saturday) morning track or Sunday morning track: Below are the options.

Kindergarten & 1 st grade	Please choose one: Shabbat or Sundays or Tuesdays
2 nd through 5 th grade	Please choose one: Shabbat and Tuesdays or Sunday and Tuesdays

Kindergarten through 5th grade will need to make a permanent choice of days at registration.

6 th grade	Shabbat and Thursdays
7 th grade	Shabbat and Thursdays
8 th grade	Shabbat or Thursday

If your child is in trope class the weekday may vary depending on the class enrolled. 8th grade may choose the days attending from week to week depending on your child's schedule.

Please mark your registration forms to which days you want your child to attend religious school. Final scheduling decisions will be based on enrollment.

Bar/Bat Mitzvah Policy: *Our synagogue adheres to the National Educational Standards set forth by the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism. The policy states that children are expected to attend either Jewish religious school or Jewish day school for five consecutive years prior to becoming Bar/Bat Mitzvah. Children must be enrolled in a Jewish educational program in the year that they become Bar/Bat Mitzvah.*
